### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

### What a week!

As we continue our work through Term 4, we continue to focus on our connections to learning. During the Student Free Day last week, teachers unpacked students results from our recent PAT (Progressive Achievement Test). Teachers identified strengths in reading and numeracy and compared this to other evidence of learning. Here are some things that we noticed:

- Student Achievement in Reading remains significantly high overall.
- Most students demonstrated Growth (at least a years' worth of Growth) in reading
- Reading and Mathematics Growth, in some areas, was 'patchy'. Noticeably as students move through Primary School particularly the transition from Year 4 through to Year 6.

### Now we know this, what next?

Over the next two weeks we will continue to analyse students achievements (Evidence of Learning) over the year, examine the Student Wellbeing Data and identify and share the successes of our work, areas of continual improvement and bring this together for reports and planning our focus for next year. This includes gaining understandings through the students' eyes. We will work with focus groups of students and unpack their thinking about what works for their learning and what are opportunities for future learning

Oh dear! Our Inquiries this term are having a HUGE impact on our Bush. Last week you might have heard 400 passionate students chanting 'SAVE OUR BUSH'. This was in response to the provocation and question set by the Year 1/2 teachers. Provocations are artifacts, experiences or questions set to engage students to think and be curious about the BIG IDEA of their Inquiry.

All classes are unpacking the Inquiry Lens of Sustainability. Teachers have worked with our Quality Teaching Coach unpacking the cycle of Inquiry so that we are responding to children's thinking, and making links to the Learning Areas (English, Science, HASS and Mathematics) to develop new understandings. Keep an eye out for "What's Popping" as we are hearing what is happening in classes around the school.

The event raised \$15, 000 and is still going. This is a tremendous amount. Congratulations to everyone in making our school a 'cut above the rest'''!


















### **DANCE PARTY**
