FROM THE PRINCIPAL..

WHAT ARE THE TEACHERS UP TO?

On our professional learning day, teachers took a deep dive into 3 key areas of school improvement for 2023. Learner Agency through the Berry Street Education Model, a focus on progressing learning through Professional Learning Teams and using Data effectively through GradeXpert were explored through workshops.

What is the Berry Street Education Model?

“The five domains of the Berry Street Education Model correspond with developmental pathways each student must master in order to be ‘ready to learn’. The first focus is building their capacity to manage the learning ready skills and then nurturing student willingness to engage:

Body: Building students’ capacity by increasing physical regulation of the stress response, de-escalation and focus.

Relationship: Nurturing on-task learning through relational classroom management strategies.

Stamina: Creating a culture of academic persistence by nurturing resilience, emotional intelligence and a growth mindset.

Engagement: Motivating students with strategies that increase their willingness to learn.

Character: Harnessing a values and character strengths approach to instil students’ self-knowledge for future pathways.”

As a school community, we have committed to develop a Whole School Approach for the Wellbeing for Learning Framework.

Our aim is for:

ALL Learners to

- Use the language and strategies from the Zones of Regulation
- Use strategies for ready for learning or ready for a challenge through Growth Mindset

ALL Teachers to

- Reintroduce/teach the language of Zones of Regulation
- Engage with DECYP Wellbeing for Learning Strategy
- Develop understanding of Berry Street Education Model through shared professional learning including Welcome Circles, Ready to Learn plans and Growth Mindset

Ask your children how they have used the Zones today? What helps them to be ‘ready for learning’ or in the green zone?

IT’S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START THINKING ABOUT 2024

We know it’s a little early and we wanted to give you a heads up. Trevallyn has a very clear process that honours the expertise and professionalism of teachers, learners’ agency and opportunities for families to share new information.

The Mimis are spirits that come out at night to tend to and tidy the land.

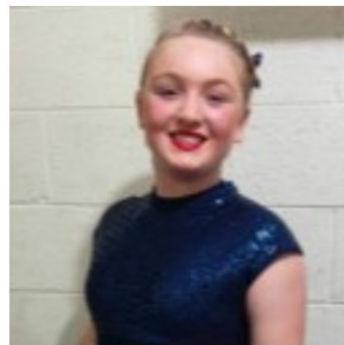
We carefully selected twigs, bark or leaves found in the bush and painted them. We later identified areas in the bush we felt needed to be treated with more care. We discovered some big holes that had been dug out with sticks that were disrupting the plants roots systems, trees where bark had been removed and dead tree trunks that had been damaged. We also collected rubbish and put it in the bin.

We hope others had the opportunity to spot the Mimi's and identify better ways we can care for Country and our school.
