How did we go?


In 2023, we set out to engage our students through Inquiry and Wellbeing. Our aim was to develop and embed learner agency through wellbeing and concept-based inquiry, so that learners will have the meta-cognitive skills to feel confident and capable to engage in learning challenges successfully. We aimed to develop this using data, assessments and evidence of learning, so that all learners progress and improve at least a measurable year.

Over the next two weeks we will be seeking your thoughts:

- How does Inquiry support your child/ren's learning?
- What does this look like in classrooms?
- What does your child/ren talk about inquiry at home?
- How does the school support your child/ren's wellbeing?
- What does this look like in the classroom?
- What does your child/ren talk about wellbeing at home?
- Has your child/ren shown progress over the year?
- How do you know?
- In 2024 what would you like to see Trevallyn Primary School work on to be even better for your children and their learning?

Hats, Hats, Hats

Throughout Term 3 and 4, our Grade 6 leaders have been seeking student and parent voice about a change to our school hats. They explored different designs and worked with the Uniform Shop committee to arrange samples.

Students have decided on a hat that matches our current uniform (navy blue) and is reversible to represent the house colours. These hats will be available in 2024, over the next 2 years both versions of the school hat (current and new) will be accepted as a transition period. By 2026, the new version will be the uniform and our uniform policy will be reviewed and adjusted as we roll out the new hats.

Supporting Outside Hours School Care

As you know, over the last few months we have been communicating the commitment Trevallyn Primary School has to Safeguarding Children. This also includes our Outside Hours School Care. We are so proud of our partnership with ABACUS Childcare, providing this important service for our community.

This service comes under National Quality Standards for Early Childhood Education and Care. It provides education and care for children before and after school and during holidays. As part of the National Quality Standards, this service must provide space inside and outside for children to access. This means that the school provides (through a lease agreement) areas across the school from 2:50/3:10pm – 6:00pm:

- ABACUS room
- 3-6 playground
- Basketball Court
- Multipurpose room
- Quadrangle

We understand that some families love to stay behind and connect after school in some of these areas, however we ask for your understanding and support. Please do not use these areas from 3:10 onwards. When adults and families stay back it is difficult for the educators. It is so very important that as a school community we support this service, and so very important that we understand this also supports our commitment to safeguarding children. Over the last few weeks adults have used the children's toilets, and spent extended time in these areas. At the end of the day, please keep all these areas free, under no circumstances use the toilets reserved for children. If you need access to toilets please check in with the front office.

Setting up our students for success in 2024

In response to student and parent feedback, we are trialling a new process for our transition into next year. Over the past few weeks, teachers have been planning special multiple experiences for children to prepare for next year and moving into new classes.

Students have been spending time with their cohorts (all Year 1s together etc.), sharing experiences and connecting with children outside of their classes. Teachers have been observing and talking to children about who they are connecting with. Next year the school will continue with our current class make up, 2xKinder Groups, 2xPrep classes, 4x Year 1/2 classes, 5x Year 3/4 classes and 5x Year 5/6 classes. We have continued with our commitment to keep class sizes on the smaller side and focus on continuity of learning. Over the next few weeks talk to your children about who they will identify to learn with next year. We work very hard to ensure children are placed in the best position for success. We ensure that children have at least one of the friends they have identified. Our aim is to try and focus on connecting children to belonging and learning.
